

Quality and Environmental Policy Statement

New Earth Solutions Group Limited (New Earth or the Company) provides waste management services to local authorities and other customers and generates renewable energy from waste-derived fuels. NES' facilities are operated in line with this policy statement and the requirements of BS EN ISO 9001:2000 and BS EN ISO 14001:2004. This policy is supported by the Company's Integrated Quality and Environmental Management System for which certification by the independent accreditation body, Det Norske Veritas (DNV), has been achieved.

New Earth's facilities are designed to meet current market conditions, comply with regulatory consents and manage any impacts upon the environment and our neighbours. The Company policy is to comply with the spirit as well as the letter of environmental legislation co-operating fully and maintaining open relationships with all regulatory authorities. The management system will support the Company in doing this and is a key element in ensuring regulatory compliance, ongoing operational improvement and enhancing customer service.

New Earth is committed to continually improve its environmental performance and the services and products it provides to customers and members of the public. The Company understands customer and regulatory requirements and assesses the environmental effects of its operations and policies with a view to preventing pollution and reducing environmental impact. Where quality and environmental aspects are deemed significant, a programme of objectives and targets have been set and reviewed to aid continuous improvement.

Through ongoing education and communication New Earth ensures that management, technical and operational personnel are fully conversant with the Company's objectives. These programmes are designed and provided for personnel at all levels within the Company. A copy of this policy is provided to all personnel, including contractors, as part of their quality and environmental awareness programme during induction training and is displayed at each New Earth facility.

The implementation and maintenance of the management system will be the responsibility of all staff. They must ensure that the staff under their jurisdiction are familiar with the requirements of the management system and that they have access to, and are fully conversant with, applicable procedures.

The New Earth directors are committed to and have assumed responsibility for quality and environmental management within the Company and have delegated the delivery and control of the management system to the Operations Director, who is responsible for co-ordinating and monitoring the effectiveness of the system through internal audits and analysis of data, both of which will form the basis of process and systems improvement.

This publicly available policy will be reviewed regularly by the New Earth management team. Commitment to this policy is important for the development and future success of the Company.
